- 2 tablespoons cream of tartar
- 1 ½ cups boiling water
- Colouring

Method:

Mix dry ingredients in a bowl.

Ask grown up to add water.

Keep mixing until it looks like dough.

Knead play dough until it is smooth and soft.

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Your Holiday Hub - feeding hungry kids

'Your Holiday Hub' is Bristol's branding of the Government's Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) programme. Started in 2018 arguably in response to footballer Marcus Rashford's outspoken attack on the government's plans not to provide support for Free Schools Meals (FSM) children during school holidays, YHH has an annual budget of £1.8m to support Bristol providers to offer a healthy meal and a minimum of 4 hours activities to eligible FSM children during 9 weeks of the Easter, Summer and Xmas holidays. At present the funding continues to 2025.



During the Easter holidays over 3,500 children in Bristol benefitted from the programme, taking up over 7,500 daily places. In Summer 2022 Bristol had one of the highest national take up of places by SEND children, over Easter 2023 this was 22.5% of the total. Aside from a healthy meal, children are given access to a huge range of enriching activities, sports and outings.
